## **Tarboro, NC National America in Bloom Awards Results Announced**

(COLUMBUS, OH): Honors for the prestigious 2012 America in Bloom (AIB) national awards program were announced at the annual awards held in Fayetteville, Arkansas on September 22.

America in Bloom executive director, Laura Kunkle, said, "America in Bloom participation is helping participating towns achieve their potential. The accomplishments and progress shown by this year's towns and cities is remarkable."

Tarboro, NC was judged on six criteria: overall impression, community involvement, environmental awareness, heritage, urban forestry, landscape, and floral displays, across four sectors: municipal, residential, commercial, and community involvement.

Specially trained judges visited towns of similar populations and spent two days touring each town, meeting municipal officials, residents, and volunteers. Additional competitors in this category were Coshocton, OH; Plymouth, IN; and Smithfield, VA.

Tarboro competed in the population category of 8,001 - 13,000, receiving a two bloom rating.

The judges, Billy Butterfield and Jack Clasen, commented, "Community spirit is high and Tarboro's residents and leaders have a "can do" attitude. The area has a lot going for it and with proper planning and vision, Tarboro has a good future."

Registrations for the 2013 national awards program can be submitted until February 28, 2013.
