


COLUMBUS, OHIO

Topiary Park, Franklin Park Conservatory, and Governor's Mansion Gardens

Love flowers and beautiful landscapes? You're in luck because this tour takes you to three Columbus locations that are sure to please any plant lover. The tour starts at the unique Topiary Park, a 9-acre public park and garden designed to depict figures from Georges Seurat's painting, "A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte." Then you will go to Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens, a world-famous site for exotic plant collections, gorgeous landscapes, and special exhibitions. The tour will end at the Ohio Governor's Mansion where you will get to experience the Heritage Garden, a special place to view Ohio's natural habitats. Different areas of the garden represent a physiographic region of the state and include native plants. The gardens give you a unique glimpse into the natural history and environmental landscape of Ohio. Lunch options are available for purchase at Franklin Park Conservatory. The cost is \$89. Adaptive Reuse: How It's Transforming a Neighborhood

Looking for ways to breathe new life into structures in your community? In a joint program with the Ohio REALTORS, this line-up will inspire you to think about how to repurpose existing structures into new uses, how mixed land use works, what compact building design looks like, and how walkable neighborhoods allow the community to thrive. You will also learn about the importance of public-private partnerships and how redevelopment is an integral part of the community development process. The day begins with an educational session on the importance of adaptive reuse to communities. A walking tour takes you to the nearby Franklinton neighborhood, a once-downtrodden community that is now the epicenter of young families and individuals looking to be close to downtown but far enough away to enjoy their own amenities. You will enjoy lunch at a local brewery, which has its own adaptive reuse history, followed by another walking tour to newer developments in the area. This tour includes lunch.
